«International Protection of Human Rights»

Programme Focus

The Master`s specialization «International Protection of Human Rights» is the only and unique programme in Russia in training highly qualified specialists for Human Rights.

The Master`s programme was established in 2009 with support of the Office of the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) and the Russian Foreign Ministry. This programme is implemented on the basis of a consortium of universities, which is chaired by Peoples` Friendship University.

Programme advantages

As part of the programme the Interuniversity Resource Center for Human Rights was established. The Resource Center is a place of giving classes for the students enrolled in this program, as well as a working space and a library, which represents a unique collection of literature in various languages, covering all fields of human rights.

As part of the research work the students have the opportunity to take part in scientific and international events and publish their works.

During the course Master students have the opportunity to attend lectures of highly qualified lecturers of the department, invited foreign lecturers, participate in master classes of international law experts of our country.

Students have the opportunity to learn several foreign languages. Not only graduates of Russian universities can take training course but also graduates from CIS and other foreign countries.

Graduates` expertise and career opportunities

Graduates can apply their knowledge and skills in the framework of their professional activities in international organizations, embassies, consulates, public service (the Russian Foreign Ministry, the Ministry of Education of Russia, the Ministry of Justice of Russia), as well as practitioners, engaged in lodging complaints with the European Court of Human Rights and other international courts.

«International Private Law»

About the profession

The program has been designed to provide students with knowledge in critical core international business law courses, while also creating the opportunity for students to pursue their own academic interests through elective courses.

The program is aimed at recently graduated lawyers and junior practitioners in its main markets who over the years have proven to be very interested in the fields of business law and arbitration. It will give lawyers the practical and theoretical skills necessary to deal with business problems and dispute resolution including arbitration, in an international or national context.

Program aim

This two-year full-time Professional LL.M. program is designed to give law graduates and lawyers from around the world advanced training in international private law.

It provides an opportunity for our students to specialize in fields not fully covered in their previous law experience; to broaden their knowledge of current field of practice; or to explore new areas of interest in legal practice.

Courses

“Introduction to International private law: Theoretical and Historical Aspect”, “Current Issues of International Private Law”, “Cross-border transactions: legal and practical aspects”, “Law of international trade”, “Protection of Intellectual Property Rights”, “Law of torts”, “International Commercial Arbitration and other ADR” “CISG and International Commercial Arbitration (Model MOOT)”, “Contracts Law (RF)”, “Insurance Law”, “Inheritance law”.

Academic practice and Legal Consulting (Internship (Optional)

Students have the option of applying for two-month, unpaid internships in settings such as law firms and legal departments of corporations. The internship qualifies as a 10 credit course. The internships are intended to provide students with the opportunity to experience what it is like to work in a RF legal setting and to apply the knowledge and skills learned throughout the course of the LL.M program.

Career Prospects

Graduates will acquire advanced specialized legal training and will be qualified to work in multinational legal environments including as an in-house legal counsel and as an attorney in arbitration and litigation practice.



«Theory and History of Law and State; Comparative Legal Studies»

Profession focus: Mastering the profession of a lawyer allows you to work in state and municipal bodies, public and private corporations, research and educational institutions. A lawyer should not only be well-versed in the field of law, but also have analytical and research skills in the field of jurisprudence. A lawyer can not be confined to skills of contemporary law and the state. Those arrays of legal norms representing contemporary law were formed gradually, accumulating historical experience of countries and peoples. Those state institutions functioning today have a long way of formation and development. Therefore, a lawyer needs to understand the nature and essence of law. Theoretical knowledge, research skills and methods of teaching the students master at the program allow them to work in different areas of the legal profession, open up opportunities in legal science and education.

Learning process: Training at master's program "Theory and History of State and Law; Comparative legal research" allows you to master modern approaches in legal science, education and practice. Objectives of the program: preparation for research activities in the field of law; study of evolutionary development and the current state of the institutions of state and law in Russia and abroad; mastering the skills of conducting research in the field of law and methods of teaching law.

Goals of the program: mastering modern methodological approaches in jurisprudence; in-depth study of the theory of law, its doctrinal, dogmatic and practical components; formation of ideas concerning the evolution and the current state of the institutions of state and law; development of comparative jurisprudence as a field of scientific knowledge, study of existing legal systems in the world, their comparative analysis; clarification of the cultural and historical features of the Russian legal system, its place and role in the global legal environment; formation of legal research skills; development of interactive teaching methods of law.

Training at master's program is conducted by a highly qualified academic staff: 6 professors, Doctors of Law, 7 teachers, PhD in Law, 5 of them are associate professors.

The disciplines taught within the program are divided into the disciplines of the general scientific course and the professional course. Each of them consists of the basic (general professional) and elective components. The disciplines of the basic component are unified for all students. The disciplines of the elective component are divided into compulsory and optional courses.

In the framework of scientific and pedagogical practice students acquire experience in teaching basic legal disciplines; under the guidance of professors and teachers of departments they master the methods of interactive learning, get acquainted with effective models of teaching law and learn to apply interactive teaching methods.

The main form of conducting pre-graduation internship is research work, where students reinforce and deepen theoretical knowledge, acquire the skills of conducting research in the field of law. The main objective of practice for master students is to build the algorithm of research within the master's thesis.

PhD program «Legal sciences. Contemporary International Law»

About the profession

The career of an international lawyer has recently become one of the most in-demand jobs. This can be accounted for by the fact that more and more companies enter foreign markets and connect with suppliers and customers abroad. International lawyers settle all kinds of disputes with foreign partners of Russian natural and juridical persons. Such a lawyer should be a good expert on legislation in many countries, understand the principles of civil and customs legislation as well as tax law. Accessing a foreign market, initiating legal action in the International Court of Justice, and carrying on foreign economic activity requires competent legal advice. By providing such assistance, lawyers carry out numerous actions which help to protect the interests of juridical and natural persons. Further, they take into consideration legislation in many countries and apply them alongside Russian legislation.

Educational process

The scientific research component of the program consists in the study of the system of international legal norms (rules contained in international treaties, international customary laws, provisions of soft law), regulating relations between states, international intergovernmental organizations and other international entities, the study of international legal ideas, principles, notions, categories, concepts characterizing essential features of international law, including the right to integration associations, as well as aims, methods and mechanisms of international legal regulation in foreign relations.

Disciplines

Post-graduates study such subjects as International Law, European Law, International Humanitarian Law, International Environmental Law, Scientific and Technological Progress and International Law.

Practical training

Practical training is a mandatory component of the post-graduate curriculum. Post-graduates engage in practical activities such as teaching certain subjects, class activity management, scientific and methodical work on a subject, and acquisition of necessary teaching skills. The teaching practicum includes study of the basics of pedagogical, educational and methodical work at the institutions of higher education, and mastering teaching skills for conducting classes on various subjects from the specialization curriculum. The main objective of the teaching practicum is to demonstrate the results of comprehensive psychological, pedagogical, socio-economic and IT readiness of a post-graduate for teaching activities. Post-graduates have access to fieldwork in government agencies, as well as Russian and international companies.

Career

Upon successful graduation, alumni have an opportunity to apply their valuable knowledge in the sphere of international protection of human rights in state structures of the Russian Federation (Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Russian Federation, Ministry of Justice of the Russian Federation, Ministry of Education and Science of the Russian Federation), in the Office of High Commissioner for Human Rights in the Russian Federation and the regions, in international and Russian non-governmental organizations, and in regional offices of international organizations in Moscow (The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, The International Committee of the Red Cross etc.). They will also be engaged in teaching activities at Russian and foreign universities.
