

Scholarship in Archaeology
Masters, Doctorate or Post-Doctorate
University of Geneva - Switzerland
Spring 2025

This exchange project is designed to establish contacts for students in classical archaeology from the University of Geneva and the State University of Erevan. The aim is to set up a dynamic research and training programme between the two institutions that will be beneficial to both and enhance their standing.

Students from Armenia will be able to complete their university programme with a good knowledge of the working methods and archaeological material related to the Mediterranean world. They will also have access to the rich archives and libraries where they will be able to find documents useful for their research. During their stay, these students may also attend all the courses given by the Faculty of Letters, and more specifically by Sciences of Antiquity, such as history of religions, ancient history, etc.

The scholarship is for a period of **six months** at the University of Geneva. It is intended for Armenian students who would like to gain more in-depth knowledge in particular of the working methods and archaeological material related to the Mediterranean world through the programme of courses in classical archaeology at the University of Geneva.

During this exchange programme Armenian students will also have access to libraries both in Geneva and in Switzerland so as to go deeper into the research they are already carrying out.

The scholarship covers travel cost, living expenses in Geneva as well as a **compulsory six-month initiation course in French at Erevan** so that he/she can begin his/her studies and research immediately on arrival.

This scholarship is part of a larger-scale project to promote an exchange of students between the two countries. We underscore how important it is for the two institutions to interact, with both benefiting from increased cooperation. The use of different approaches and the synergy inherent in these exchanges could lead to future cooperation both in Armenia and in research projects linked to the Classical Archaeology Unit at the University of Geneva

Candidates are invited to submit their CV with a copy of their passport and their diplomas as well as a letter of motivation and a short summary of their project for a Masters, Doctorate or Post Doctorate (maximum 1,000 words) and a plan for their stay in Switzerland (with a timetable, project, courses planned to take) **prior to 20 July 2024**.
